fun chasing bubbles to see how far they travel!


The reading corner is in regular use. For audio books and regular books!

Science we are learning about how sound is made and how it travels.




we are learning about Place

different types of Maps that we'll be using in Geography; from doing a deep dive




 into different word classes to support our

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### **IMPORTANT SCHOOL INFORMATION**



### **REMINDER OF NEW ATTENDANCE REGULATIONS**

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As many of you are aware, the school attendance regulations have now come into effect.

Under the new statutory guidance, the school will continue to monitor the children's attendance and now where a child has 10 sessions of unauthorised absences within a rolling 10 week period, you could be subject to a penalty notice (fine). **10 sessions equates to 5 school days.** 

Please note ALL holiday requests will be unauthorised, unless deemed as an exceptional circumstance. All unauthorised holiday or leave of absences, regardless of the amount of days taken, will now be included in these 10 sessions. Before, you were subject to a penalty notice for 5 or more days holiday only. For example, the 10 sessions within a 10 week period can be met with any combination of unauthorised absence, e.g. 4 sessions (2 days) of holiday taken in term time plus 6 sessions of arriving late after the register closes all within 10 school weeks will be subject to a fine. These sessions can also be consecutive, e.g. 10 sessions (5 days) of holiday in one week or not, e.g. 6 (3 days) sessions of unauthorised absence taken in 1 week and 1 per week for the next 4 weeks. Please note, the period of 10 school weeks can also span different terms or school years, e.g. 2 sessions of unauthorised absence in the Summer Term and a further 8 within the Autumn Term.

As a reminder, illness and medical related absences are authorised if reasons are given and if requested justified with medical evidence. These sessions do not count towards the 10 sessions of unauthorised absences unless they become ongoing and medical evidence cannot be provided.

Arnesby School is adhering to the new Government's 'Working Together to Improve School Attendance' August 2024 statutory school guidance which can be found via the link below:


For all children to shine brightly, we have learnt in Worship this week about the importance of drinking water throughout the day, to keep us happy, healthy and ready to learn.




### **Boot Camp**
