








ed upstairs in the education room where they explored artefacts from different festivals and celebrations. Then they went downstairs into the synagogue where they found out where the worship took place.



Do you know what 3/4 of 400 is? Because we do!



Some people went as plumbers, witches, knights and supernatural creatures.


























Oscar said "my favourite subject is History". In History we have been learning about world War 2 and about Adolf Hitler and Chamberlain and the appeasement.


