Our Preaching Cross


Rev Stephen gave his final worship to the school as he blessed our new Preaching Cross.

Originally the Preaching Cross was the forerunner of village markets and churches. Priests would ride around the country on donkeys or horses calling at those villages that didn't have a church. The meeting point in the village was the Preaching Cross where the people would gather around to hear the priest preach

the Gospels.

The children had coloured some Christian symbols and written prayers which were hung onto the cross in preparation for the blessing.

The Faith group asked for the cross to help bring courage and comfort, hope and inspiration.





In school we will use the cross in different parts of the school and playground, where children can pray or celebrate or sit and contemplate in a quiet space.






Our Curriculum is based on inspirational learning activities which take place in a classroom environment that allows children to learn in a way that motivates and interests them.






Breakfast and After school clubs

Breakfast and afterschool clubs are an important part of the school's offer and Mrs.

James would like to organise a parent forum to help decide what clubs are needed or preferred going forward, including times and activities. If you are interested in being part of this focus group please let Mrs. James know via the school office and fill in the Microsoft form which will help us to find a suitable day and time. The next academic year will see a price increase for both clubs as these have been maintained at the same price for more than 2 years. Breakfast Club will increase 50p to £3.50 and After School Club will increase by 50p to £4.50 from next term. Booking is done in the usual way and all times remain the same at present.

We have worked with the school sports offer through Super Star Sports and have decided that each day will now have a focus sport. These sports will run for the half term and we will change the focus each half term based on the feedback from children and parents. Please try and support these clubs if you can.


