


What's happening in school? Peace Class

Peace Class shining in fairy tale imagination

This term in Peace Class we have some exciting units of learning to complete. We will be diving into a fascinating new topic in History: Castles. The children will explore what castles are, why they were built, and who might have lived in them. From mighty kings and queens to brave knights and hardworking servants, we'll uncover the many roles and stories hidden within castle walls.



In Science, our focus is Materials. The children will be learning what materials are, where they come from, and how we use them in everyday life.



They will explore the properties of different materials — such as whether they are hard or soft, waterproof or absorbent, flexible or rigid — and investigate why certain materials are chosen for specific jobs. There will be plenty of hands-on activities to help them test, sort, and compare materials in fun and practical ways.

Our Art topic this term is Explore the World Through Mono Print. The children will experiment with mono printing techniques to create bold, expressive artwork. They'll learn how to build up images using lines, textures, and patterns, and they'll explore how artists use printmaking to represent the world around them. This topic encourages creativity, curiosity, and a willingness to try new artistic processes.


Reception have had a magical start to our Fairy Tales topic this term. The children have loved diving into the worlds of Goldilocks and the Three Bears and The Three Little Pigs. They've been brilliant at retelling the stories, acting out the characters, and exploring the themes through play.

Over the next few weeks, we'll be exploring even more traditional tales. The children are already buzzing with excitement to find out what's coming next.





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What's happening in school? Courage Class


Courage class shining in times tables!




Courage Class have been thinking hard about learning our times tables so that we are super fluent! From TTRS to bingo games we are practising quick recall to help with our maths learning about multiplication and division this term.

In English we are exploring grammar and spelling through the book the wolf's secret. Ask the children why they stood on one leg for the present perfect tense!

Our topic in Geography is energy and learning about all the types of generating energy for our homes and schools both renewable and non-renewable. In RE we are thinking again about



Christianity and what kind of world would Jesus want today. In science we are learning about forces and healthy eating in PSHE. Our computing topic in Online safety which the children are really enjoying.

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What's happening in school? Endurance Class

Endurance class shining in movement

In Endurance class we have hit the ground running after the Christmas holidays. We've opened a variety of new units to work on this half term.

In History, we've begun our exploration of how Britain has changed between 1066 and the modern day – so far we've looked at the impact of Henry VIII separating from the Catholic Church and establishing the monarchy as the heads of the Church of England and some of the far reaching impacts of this decision that can still be seen in Britain today.



In Science we've begun looking at Space, exploring how the movement of the Earth and Moon in relation to the Sun create things like the day/night cycle, seasons and

allow us to track years. We've developed visual demonstrations to help understand these phenomena in more detail.



Rather appropriately, in Spanish we've started looking at ways to discuss the weather including learning how to say whether the weather is good or bad, cold, warm, raining, sunny, snowing etc. Given the somewhat tumultuous weather we've had since coming back to school, this has been rather valuable to discuss.



In PSHE we've been exploring the different ways that we can take control of our own health looking at rest, relaxation and the importance of sleep. We've engaged in relaxing guided meditative stretching and learned about the three layers of sleep and the different patterns that can be observed.

In music we've been looking at metre, learning how to read time signatures in music and tracking beats in a bar using a variety of methods such as body percussion or (oddly) using table tennis balls.



Luke said "I enjoyed working as a team".


Freddie said "It was great, I can't wait to do it again!".

If you need to leave a message please see either Mrs James or Mrs Lawson at the gate or phone the school office.



BREAKFAST CLUB


Our breakfast club is available from 8am to 8.45am facilitated by different members of staff.
